Objectives at Formation

- improve information sharing between vendors, owners and operators, and other organizations involved in securing ICS
- increase collaboration between control systems vendors and standards development organizations
- create a more effective framework for cyber risk management within ICS environments

 - 44 vendors
 - 11 service providers
 - 2 owner-operators
 - 7 government
- Regular conference calls
 - Beginning in August 2009
 - Monthly frequency

Work Plan

- Identify participant categories, establish goals for each and assess participation level
- Identify methods for improved collaboration
- Define the interaction required with other ICSJWG subgroups
 - e.g., Roadmap, Research and Development
- Develop specific objectives to address aspects of ICS security
 - In response to interactions identified above

Challenges

- Membership and participation criteria
 - Complicated by the name "<u>Vendor</u> Subgroup"
 - Now largely resolved
- Lack of clarity of basic objectives
 - Overlap with other groups
 - Currently being addressed
