PUBLIC HEALTH TRAINING CENTERS

The Public Health Training Centers (PHTC) program was funded under the Prevention and Public Health Fund of the Affordable Care Act to improve the Nation's public health system by strengthening the technical, scientific, managerial, and leadership competence of the current and future public health workforce. The program is administered by the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA), an agency of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services.

The PHTC program focuses on the needs and preparation of the public health workforce in governmental public health agencies. Consistent with the Healthy People 2020 Public Health Infrastructure objectives, the PHTC grantees develop activities to prepare the workforce to carry out essential public health services. PHTC grantees are schools of public health accredited by the Council on Education for Public Health or other public or nonprofit private institutions accredited for the provision of graduate or specialized training in public health.

Currently, the 37 funded PHTCs:

- Designate a specific geographical area to be served;
- Establish or strengthen field placements for students in public or nonprofit private health agencies or organizations;
- Involve faculty and students in collaborative projects to enhance public health services to underserved communities;
- Assess the health personnel needs of the area to be served by the center in partnership with practice
 partners and assist in planning, developing, and implementing training programs to meet the identified
 needs.
