Five university-based Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorders (FASD) Regional Training Centers (RTCs) have been funded for a three-year cooperative agreement (2008–2011) to develop, implement, and evaluate new training programs, and/or enhance current training programs for medical and allied health students and practitioners regarding the prevention, identification, and treatment of fetal alcohol spectrum disorders (FASDs). Four RTCs were previously funded from 2002–2008. These four former RTCs developed seven core competencies in collaboration with CDC and with the National Organization on Fetal Alcohol Syndrome (NOFAS) as well as the FASD Competency Based Curriculum Development Guide for Medical and Allied Health Education and Practice, available at www.cdc. gov/fasd. 


