## **SORNA Substantial Implementation Review Ohkay Owingeh Tribe**

The U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, Office of Sex Offender Sentencing, Monitoring, Apprehending, Registering, and Tracking (SMART) would like to thank Ohkay Owingeh for the extensive work that has gone into its effort to substantially implement Title I of the Adam Walsh Act, the Sex Offender Registration and Notification Act (SORNA). The SMART Office has completed its review of the Ohkay Owingeh Tribe's SORNA substantial implementation packet and has found that Ohkay Owingeh has substantially implemented SORNA.

On April 14, 2011, Ohkay Owingeh submitted a substantial implementation package, including background information on the tribe and its criminal justice system, courts, and police department, policies and procedures regarding sex offender registration, the tribe's sex offender registration law and relevant additional laws, as well as forms to guide registration and give notice to offenders. In addition, email and phone correspondence with Lieutenant Kenneth Maes informed this review.<sup>1</sup>

Our review of these materials follows the outline of the SMART Office Substantial Implementation Checklist-Revised, which contains 14 sections addressing the SORNA requirements. Under each section, we indicate whether Ohkay Owingeh meets the SORNA requirements of that section or deviates from the requirements in some way. In instances of deviation, we specify where the departure(s) from a particular requirement does not substantially disserve the purposes of that requirement.

Ohkay Owingeh responded to all concerns and rectified deviations from requirements in order to achieve full implementation of SORNA. This report is an exhaustive review and is intended to detail every area in which the tribe has not met SORNA standards. We encourage you to review the information below, share it with relevant stakeholders in the tribe, and get back in touch with us to develop a strategy to address these remaining issues.
