# Charlie Company Mission




ONE TEAM, ONE MISSION

# Voting / Physical Security

  - Money and Valuables (safes/room security)





- Open Door Policy (Leadership accessible to all)
- Policy Memorandums (Read & Familiarize by 1700 today)
- BN/Company Motto: One Team, One Mission!
- Motorcycle Riders MUST have completed advance rider course within 90 days after basic ride course; if not, NO RIDING!
- Death of a C Co, TSB Soldier (Only CAO/CNO may contact family / friends)
- Chaplains available (CH Michel / CH Mchort); EOC CH on-call on weekends/off-duty hours – contact PSG/1SG
- All Soldiers, Marines, & Sailors will get an Accident Avoidance Card immediately!
- Student Leadership / NCO Authority
  - PSG / SQD LDR
  - Accountability / Counseling / Pass Review / UCMJ & Award Recommendation





- Barracks / Surrounding are maintenance (any issues with room must be reported to Floor SGT and PSG for work orders)
- Formations / Uniform (white board, check 3 times a day; prior to 0530, between 1100-1300, and between 1630-1830)
- Curfew (school nights 2200 hours)
- Student with vehicles (parking, driving, updated paperwork)
- High Risk Events (e.g. skydiving, swimming/track and field, and field/road march/weapons ranges, etc): inform chain of CMD before conducting
- Room Standard (i.e. weekly clean up, living standards, weekly inspections, no alcohol)
- Duty Day (ends at 1500/civilians, 0900-1130 and 1400-1500 if no class must be in day room





- 369<sup>th</sup> AG IET Soldiers off limits only class room interaction (improper relations)
- TDY (does not mean Temporarily Divorced for a Year)
- CQ Brief
- Passes (due date, attention to detail, only exception for turning passes in late, cannot be taken in barracks)
- Leave DA Form 31 (TDY en-route/ Prior Service must submit week before graduation)
- PT Belts (Yellow=general population, Red=Hot Weather Injury, Blue=Cold Weather Injury, Orange=Allergies); must sign out a PT belt from supply
- NCO leaders (PSGs & SQD LDRs) will wear reflective PT vests during PRT





- Proper authorization for lodging (statements needed)
- Inappropriate Cadence forbidden (derogatory terms/cursing)
- NO CELL PHONE USE IN CQ AREA, MAIN ENTRANCE, IN FRONT OF THE BUILDING!
  - Authorized for use in the dayroom, your room, bleachers, smoking area
- Stay off the grass





- APFT
  - Exemptions (ASIs)
  - One failure = remedial PRT; Second failure = flagged
  - Failure affects your DA 1059
- Weigh-in
  - Every Monday/Tuesday





- Fire Drill Safety Instructions
  - Take the nearest exit on each floor (2 minutes to evacuate)
  - CQ NCO will designate the first two NCOs they see to be placed at the front and back doors to direct the Soldiers to accountability location
  - All Soldiers will form up at PT location for accountability (everyone must go directly to that location)
  - Student NCOs will take charge of the formation(s) at accountability location until cadre arrives
