Course: IS-522 Exercising Continuity Plans for Pandemics

Date: Available online

Course Description:

This course is based on the Determined Accord pandemic continuity tabletop exercise. It covers fundamental continuity principles and processes but is focused on the special requirements for pandemics. Strategies such as telework and other social distancing strategies are described as well as special protection strategies for first responders, healthcare personnel, and others who have daily contact with the public. In this online course, the students watch a discussion among first responders and respond to related questions. The flexible delivery classroom version of this course includes the Determined Accord exercise based on the recent H1N1 pandemic.

Course Goals:

At the conclusion of this course, the students should be able to:

- Relate the anticipated conditions and effects of a pandemic influenza to responders and communities.
- 2. Describe best practices for planning for and responding to a pandemic influenza.
- 3. Apply knowledge of the anticipated conditions and suggested practices to an activity.
- 4. Develop next steps for pandemic planning within their agencies or communities.

Prerequisite:

Independent Study-520: Introduction to Continuity Operations Planning for Pandemic Influenza.

Course Length: 1 day

Target Audience:

The primary audience for this course includes all who may be responsible for developing continuity plans for pandemics.
