Course: E174 HAZUS Multi-Hazard (HAZUS-MH) for Earthquake

Date: February 7-10, 2011

Course Description:

This course is designed to provide in-depth instruction on the use of HAZUS-MH for advanced applications related to earthquake-loss modeling. The Earthquake Model provides loss estimates of damage and loss to buildings, essential facilities, transportation lifelines, utility lifelines, and population based on scenario or probabilistic earthquakes.

Course Goal:

- Course provides an in-depth discussion of the HAZUS inventory with emphasis on those inventory components that are of critical importance to the earthquake model and the process for updating both aggregate and site-specific inventory with local data.
- 2. The class provides a discussion of how HAZUS-MH can be used to conduct advanced analysis using the Advanced Engineering Building Module (AEBM).
- The class provides a discussion on model uncertainties, and applications of the model for assessing mitigation strategies, as well as, for response and recovery activities.

Prerequisite:

E313 Basic HAZUS-MH course.

Target Audience:

The course is intended for the following: State and local emergency managers; State and local Geographical Interface System (GIS) specialists, and Federal agencies with risk assessment responsibilities.
