AT&T Creates New App and Website to Bring "To the Brink: JFK and the Cuban Missile Crisis" Exhibit to Online World

App and Website Feature Documents, Images and White House Recordings from Groundbreaking Exhibit at The National Archives

Washington, DC, October 22, 2012 – AT&T, in partnership with the National Archives, its John F. Kennedy Presidential Library and Museum, the Foundation for the National Archives, and the Kennedy Library Foundation, has created an app and website of the new exhibit, "To the Brink: JFK and the Cuban Missile Crisis," bringing it to online audiences around the world. The app is available for free download in the Apple Store and at www.JFKCMC.org, where Android phone and tablet users can also experience the exhibit.

"To the Brink" is a new exhibit at the National Archives that looks back at the Cuban Missile Crisis from the 50-year mark. The exhibit shows President Kennedy and his advisers in the throes of deliberation during 13 agonizing days in October 1962, as the United States and the Soviet Union stood on the brink of nuclear war. The peaceful resolution of the crisis, resulting in the removal of Soviet nuclear missiles from Cuba, is considered to be one of Kennedy's greatest achievements.

As lead sponsor of "To the Brink," AT&T worked with the National Archives, its Kennedy Library, and their foundations to create the free app. AT&T worked with Seattle-based Treemo Labs to build the app.

"AT&T is proud to bring virtual access to this remarkable exhibit assembled by the National Archives and its John F. Kennedy Presidential Library and Museum," said Jim Cicconi, AT&T senior executive vice president. "Through the power of innovative technologies and networks, many more Americans will be able to experience an exhibit – including the actual recordings of President Kennedy and his advisors --- that brings to life one of the most important moments in American history."

"So much of what our foundation has supported at the National Archives involves harnessing new media to spread the word about the great treasure of historical records here," added A'Lelia Bundles, Chair and President of the Foundation for the National Archives, the Archives' private-sector partner. "Through innovative websites like the Digital Vaults and DocsTeach, through Facebook and other new media, we have been able to expand our reach, so that students, teachers, and lifelong learners can access and use the records of our democracy. Great partnerships like this one with AT&T make it all possible, and we are most grateful for their support."

"To the Brink: JFK and the Cuban Missile Crisis" is showing at the National Archives' Lawrence F. O'Brien Gallery in Washington, DC. Early next year, the exhibit will travel to the Kennedy Library in Boston.

Visitors to "To the Brink" will hear recordings of the President in White House meetings with his closest advisors, working to avert thermonuclear war after the Soviet Union installed missiles in Cuba capable of targeting the United States. The recordings and other National Archives records document the dramatic events that brought the United States and the Soviet Union to the brink of war and back again.

Exhibit Curator Stacey Bredhoff of the Kennedy Library authored an accompanying exhibition catalog, also titled *To the Brink*, published by the Foundation for the National Archives.

As lead sponsor of the exhibit, AT&T donated \$500,000 to support "To the Brink," in addition to the creation of the app. AT&T also has had a long history of supporting the work of the National Archives and its JFK Library and Museum. It

was a founding partner in the creation of the Kennedy Presidential Library's online digital archives, providing more than \$2.23 million in in-kind support to preserve, catalogue, and digitize the papers of President Kennedy and make them available to the public through the World Wide Web.
