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Archives Shop to Feature Products Designed for "What's Cooking, Uncle Sam?" Exhibition at the National Archives

Washington, DC – In conjunction with the "What's Cooking, Uncle Sam?" exhibition, the Archives Shop has developed for sale a wide selection of engaging products based on images and themes from the exhibition.

Vintage poster images developed by the U.S. Government with messages that are timely today have been adapted to aprons, bibs, adult and children's t-shirts, coasters, trays, magnets, lunch bags, and re-usable grocery totes.

Some of these images include: A cartoon potato called Field Marshal "Potato Pete," children encouraging the eating of "Vitamin Donuts," a chef suggesting you "Know Your Onions," children who "belong to the U.S. School Garden Army," and a mother and child encouraging you to "can all you can." These products are offered in a wide price range and enable the visitor to take away fun and functional reminders of the history behind the food we eat.

The Shop will also feature the exhibition catalog, *What's Cooking, Uncle Sam? The Government's Effect on the American Diet*, written by exhibition curator Alice Kamps, as well as a recipe book, *Eating with Uncle Sam: Recipes and Historical Bites from the National Archives,* which includes recipes from each of the 13 Presidential libraries and museums.
