## Utility Procurement

ARS only has authority to contract for utilities for a period not to exceed one year. For details regarding utility purchases refer to APD Alert 2013-01 and Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR) 41.201(b).

## <u>Federal Acquisition Certifications:</u> <u>Contracting (FAC-C) & Contracting Officer Representative (FAC-COR)</u>

As a reminder on <u>October 1, 2012</u>, the Federal Acquisition Institute (FAI) stopped accepting legacy courses CON 101, CON 104, CON 202, CON 204, and CON 210 to meet the requirements for FAC-C. Effective <u>November 1, 2012</u>, individuals that allow their FAC-C or FAC-COR expire must reapply for certification using the current certification requirements; i.e., legacy courses previously used to become certified will not be accepted for recertification. In addition, individuals must demonstrate completion of the continuous learning that caused the initial certificate to expire.
