Truman, Herbert H. Hoover. William Knowland administers oath to Richard Nixon. Vinson administers oath to Eisenhower. Eisenhower gives Inaugural Prayer and Address. Luncheon at Senate follows. The film opens with a view of the crowd at the inaugural ball at the National Guard Armory in Washington. The announcers talk with George Murphy, then discuss a few of the guests and their attire. Among the guests mentioned are Mrs. Everett Dirksen and Mrs. Arthur Summerfield. The entertainers mentioned include the bands of Lionel Hampton, Fred Waring, Wayne King, and Guy Lombardo; the Marine Band Orchestra; the Meyer Davis Orchestra; singer Jeannette McDonald. The scene shifts to Eisenhower, Mamie, John and Barbara Eisenhower, and Elivera Doud as they prepare to depart. The next scene is the ball at McDonough Auditorium at Georgetown University. Announcers Ben Grauer and Ray Michaels discuss the size of the crowd, then cover the arrival of Richard and Pat Nixon, John and Barbara Eisenhower, Elivera Doud, and Mr. and Mrs. Charles Wilson. Eisenhower and Mamie enter. Albert Melchior sings the Star Spangled Banner and Because, then Gladys Swarthout sings Bless This House.

**EL-MP16-237 DWIGHT D. EISENHOWER BECOMES THE 34th PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES**

January 20, 1953, crowds from all over country pour into Washington for the inauguration. Eisenhower, Mamie, and John Eisenhower arrive, attend religious services and are met at the White House by President Harry and Bess Truman. Following a motorcade to the Capitol, dignitaries file through the Rotunda. Among these are members of Congress, the Supreme Court, the Diplomatic Corps, the Joint Chiefs of Staff, General George C. Marshall, Truman's cabinet, Herbert Hoover. Senator William F. Knowland administers the oath to Richard M. Nixon, then Eisenhower is sworn in by Chief Justice Fred M. Vinson. Eisenhower offers the inaugural prayer, then addresses the nation. Eisenhower presents Mamie, then they attend the parade. January 21, 1953, the cabinet members take office. Oaths are administered to John Foster Dulles and Oveta Culp Hobby.

**EL-MP16-247 INAUGURATION DAY Washington, DC January 20, 1953**

Reel 1: NBC commentators Morgan Beattie and Clifton Utley describes the pre-inaugural scene and point out the locations of the NBC cameras. Eisenhower, Mamie, Joseph Martin and Styles Bridges arrive at the White House and are greeted by President Harry Truman, Bess and Margaret. The group follows the parade route to the Capitol. The invocation is given by Archbishop Patrick O'Boyle. Dorothy Maynor sings the anthem, Sen. William Knowland administers the vice presidential oath to Richard Nixon; Eugene Conley sings America The Beautiful. Rabbi Silver offers a prayer, then Eisenhower is sworn in by Chief Justice Fred M. Vinson. Eisenhower gives inaugural prayer, then begins his inaugural address. Among those on the platform are Harry S. Truman, Mamie Eisenhower, Herbert Hoover, Richard Nixon. Reel 2: Eisenhower concludes his inaugural address. H. V. Kalterborn analyzes the address as the President prepares for the parade. Eisenhower and Mamie are escorted to the White House by a police

squad and the 1st Battalion of the Third Infantry. Eisenhower, Mamie, Richard Nixon, Herbert Hoover, and Joseph Martin view the parade from the reviewing stand. The parade includes West Point Cadets, a religious float, the District of Columbia ROTC, the Abilene Kansas Cowboy Band, the Wyandotte County Horse troop, a miniature stagecoach, a California horse troop (led by Governor Earl Warren in a car), and the US Naval Academy.
