 Pain management for arachnoiditis is not feasible for a full systematic review due to the limited data available for a review at this time.

Topic Description	
Nominator:	Individual
Nomination Summary:	The nominator is interested in the comparative effectiveness of pain management strategies to relieve pain from arachnoiditis.
	 Staff-Generated PICO Population(s): Individuals suffering from arachnoiditis. Intervention(s): Pain relief using transcutaneous electrical nerve stimulation (TENS), tramadol hydrochloride (an opioid), gabapentin (an anti-epileptic), spinal steroid injection, and surgery. Comparator(s): See Interventions. Outcome(s): Reduction in chronic back pain, increased ability to perform activities of daily living. Harms: increased pain, lessened mobility.
