Past Activities



Compliance Focus:

- To ensure that the reporting and querying requirements are met by all entities
- To educate reporting and querying entities
- To improve completeness and accuracy of reporting to the Data Bank



Compliance Activities to Date:

- Never Reported Profession Compliance Project
- Adverse Licensure Action Comparison Project



Never Reported Profession Project

- Developed a list of state agencies responsible for licensing or certifying health care professionals
- List was compared to data in the HIPDB
- States received letters for professions for which no data were found in the HIPDB



Adverse Licensure Action Project

- Compared publicly available disciplinary data with HIPDB data
- In some cases, requested data from state boards and agencies if we could not find data
- Requested reconciliation of data that were not matched to reports in the Data Bank

Hospital Initiative

Hospital Initiative

The next major compliance outreach project involves hospitals, using a two-pronged approach.

First, determine the universe of hospitals:

- Work with American Hospital Association (AHA) to obtain accurate data on the universe of hospitals
- Compare AHA data with information about hospitals currently registered with the Data Banks
- Conduct outreach with any hospitals identified by gap analysis

Second, develop a hospital review process:

- Understand credentialing, peer review processes and impact on adverse action reporting
- Conduct discussion groups with stakeholders, e.g.:
 - Executive Committee members
 - Hospital representatives
 - Health Care Compliance Association members
 - AHLA members
 - National Association of Medical Staff Services members
- Use existing data sources to determine how to strengthen hospital review process



New State Compliance Framework

New State Compliance Framework

The new State Compliance Framework is a 2-step process that will examine the compliance status of reporting by state licensing and certification boards:

- Part 1: For the top 12 professions, perform a
 1-to-1 match of data in the Data Bank
- Part 2: For other professions, ask boards to attest to reporting status

New State Compliance Framework, Part 1, continued

Half the states and territories will be reviewed each year, with this first 2-year cycle:

- The first year covers actions for 2010-11
 - 25% of states will be reviewed, with online postings by April 1, 2013
 - 25% of states will be reviewed, with online postings by October 1, 2013
- The second year covers actions for 2010-12
 - 25% of states will be reviewed, with online postings by April 1, 2014
 - 25% of states will be reviewed, with online postings by October 1, 2014

New State Compliance Framework, Part 2

For professions regulated by state licensing and certification boards outside the top 12: During a board's registration renewal process, the board will be asked to attest that it has reported all actions to date.

The Data Bank will post online whether individual boards have attested they have reported all actions to date, whether they say they cannot so attest, or whether they have not responded.










