

Houston-Sugar Land-Baytown, TX

- In 2011, the Houston metropolitan area was the 2nd largest export market in the United States, with merchandise shipments totaling \$104.5 billion. This is up \$23.9 billion (29.6 percent) from the \$80.6 billion in merchandise exported in 2010.
- The Houston metropolitan area accounted for 52.3 percent of Texas' merchandise exports in 2011.
- For the top 50 U.S. merchandise export destinations, Houston ranks among the major metropolitan area exporters to Mexico (\$16.7 billion), Brazil (\$7.1 billion), the Netherlands (\$4.4 billion), Singapore (\$4.4 billion), and Colombia (\$2.9 billion).
- Houston ranks among the major metropolitan area exporters of Petroleum and Coal Products (\$35.2 billion), Chemicals (\$30.3 billion), Machinery, Except Electrical (\$14.0 billion), Oil and Gas Extraction (\$5.0 billion), and Fabricated Metal Products (\$3.3 billion).
- In 2011, Houston benefited from existing trade agreements, exporting \$27.6 billion to the NAFTA region and \$4.6 billion to the CAFTA-DR region.
- 26.4 percent of Houston's merchandise exports go to NAFTA countries.
