The Public Computer Centers have been successful in promoting the ease of access to broadband technology to the more than 40 thousand guests who have benefited from the services provided. The BTOP PCC has also promoted economic recovery through the hiring of 30 professional staff members to manage the 30 opened and operating PCC's throughout Southern Nevada. Hundreds of visitors have benefited from the Resume Workshop training initiatives hosted at the PCC's. The BTOP PCC's initiatives have been covered by local print and television media on visitor success stories in finding employment, all due to the BTOP PCC's being available to offer free broadband and Training services to the public. The BTOP PCC's have been successful in training visitors how to search for jobs, create email accounts, and office application readiness.
