SUBJECT: Request for a Revised Implementation Date for Approved MILSTRIP Change Letter (AMCL) 29, Processing Mass Cancellation Requests

The attached change to DoD 4000.25-M, Defense Logistics Management System (DLMS), Volume 2, and DoD 4000.25-1-M, Military Standard Requisitioning and Issue Procedures (MILSTRIP), is forwarded for evaluation and submission of the earliest coordinated Service/Agency implementation date.

This change is one of approximately 26 MILSTRIP and MILSTRAP approved changes which the Components were unable to implement on schedule as resources were shifted to support the Corporate Information Management (CIM) single standard system effort. With the demise of that effort, the Defense Logistics Management Standards Office (DLMSO), with the DoD Supply Process Review Committee (PRC), has agreed to establish revised implementation dates. AMCL 29 was initially published as an approved change on November 28, 1989 with implementation scheduled for May 1, 1994. The Components agreed to the submission of AMCL 29 for a revised implementation date at the DoD Supply PRC meeting 98-2. We will use the dates provided in response to this request to establish a mutually satisfactory revised implementation date.

Procedures associated with this approved change have been incorporated in the DoD 4000.25-M, DLMS, Volume 2 based upon the original AMCL. In addition, this change was among those included in the publication of MILSTRIP Formal Change 8 and was not pulled out with the publication of MILSTRIP Formal Change 9.

Please review the attached change and provide your earliest implementation date to DLMSO no later than 60 days from the date of this memorandum. 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**APPROVED MILSTRIP CHANGE 29  
PROCESSING MASS CANCELLATION REQUESTS**

**1. References:**

- a. DoD 4000.25-1-M, May 1, 1987, Military Standard Requisitioning and Issue Procedures (MILSTRIP), as amended.
- b. MILSTRIP Focal Point Committee Meeting, 87-3, January 6-7, 1987.

**2. Change Concept/Rationale:**

- a. **Concept:** Revise the procedures for processing a mass cancellation request so that the effective date, cutoff date, and the action to be taken are more clearly stated.
- b. **Rationale:** At MILSTRIP Focal Point Committee Meeting 87-3, the DLA representative requested clarification of MILSTRIP processing of mass cancellations in regard to the effective date, cutoff date, action to be taken when a mass cancellation is received, and when the edits should cease.

**3. Interface/Impact:**

- a. **Interface:** Between requisitioners and supply sources.
- b. **Impact:** Require changes to MILSTRIP and Service/Agency implementing procedures.

**4. Procedures:**

- a. Delete paragraph A3c(2), chapter 8, in its entirety.
- b. Renumber paragraph A3c(3) as A3c(2), chapter 8.
- c. Revise paragraph C2, chapter 8, to read:

***"Supply Sources will cancel all requisitions dated on or prior to the effective date announced in mass or universal cancellation requests for which MROs, DD Form 1348-1A, or purchase requests have not been submitted to storage or procurement activities. Notice of accomplished cancellations will be provided by BQ or B4 supply status (DI AE\_), as appropriate, and transmitted to all eligible status recipients under chapter 4 and within the timeframe for furnishing status."***
