



Pentagon Renovation Committee Honors Army Information Technology Agency

Washington, D.C.—The US Army Information Technology Agency was recognized earlier this summer with a prestigious award presented by the Pentagon Renovation (PenRen) Committee at its conclusion ceremonies for support of the PenRen program.

“So many people played such a critical role in changing and shaping what today is the renovated Pentagon- the headquarters of the best military in the world,” said ITA’s Executive Director Don Adcock in his speech to employees at a recent ITA Town Hall event.

Mr. Adcock accepted the award on behalf of the agency during the ceremonies hosted by the Pentagon Renovation Committee, marking the end of the seventeen year renovation lifecycle.

John Maditz, ITA’s Director for the Integrated Infrastructure and Telecommunications Services (I2TS) Directorate explained how ITA worked closely with PenRen on all aspects of the renovation project, including providing critical communication and networking support. This support enabled Pentagon tenants to take advantage of the advances in IT services to better serve their mission needs.

“ITA truly served as the operational arm of PenRen during the renovation period,” Mr. Maditz explained. “Throughout the entire process, PenRen and ITA worked so closely together that most Pentagon tenants believed they were a single organization.”

In addition to the agency award, ITA was presented with two PenRen medallion coins which were given to two ITA employees who were integral to the success of the Pentagon Renovation project. Coins were presented to Ms. Marina Ibrahim and Mr. Rich Williams for their exemplary service in supporting PenRen.
