MEMORANDUM FOR SUPPLY PROCESS REVIEW COMMITTEE MEMBERS

SUBJECT: Approved Defense Logistics Management System (DLMS) Change (ADC) 147, Revise DLMS Supplement 140A, Small Arms Reporting to Reflect Serial Number and Other Administrative Changes (Supply) (Staffed by PDC 156)

The attached change to DOD 4000.25-M. DLMS, is approved for immediate implementation. The updated DLMS Supplement will be posted to the Defense Logistics Management Standards Office (DLMSO) Web site (<u>http://www.dla.mil/j-6/dlmso/ICs/Default.htm</u>) within 30 days from the above date for implementation planning. DLMSO will submit this transaction concurrently to the governing Federal Implementation Convention to the DOD Electronic Data Interchange Standards Management Committee, and the Federal Electronic Data Interchange Standards Management Coordinating Committee, and applicable working groups.

A follow-on ADC will be released to incorporate the DOD Unique Identification (UID) concept of unique item identifier (UII), in addition to the serial number, to DS 140A. The DOD Small Arms Serialization Program (DODSASP) is not exempt from UID policy, hence DS 140A will be updated in the subsequent ADC to allow for small arms tracking by UII or serial number, until such time as the DOD Components fully implement the OSD UID policy. ATTACHMENT TO ADC 147 Revise DLMS Supplement 140A, Small Arms Reporting, to Reflect Serial Number and Other Administrative Changes (Supply)

1. ORIGINATOR:

a. Service/Agency: Defense Logistics Management Standards Office (DLMSO)

b. Originator: Ms. Mary Jane Johnson, DLMSO; Chair Joint Small Arms Coordinating Group; Chair, Unique Item Tracking Committee.

2. FUNCTIONAL AREA: Supply/DOD Small Arms Serialization Program.

3. REQUESTED CHANGE:

a. Title: Revise DLMS Supplement (DS) 140A, Small Arms Reporting.

b. Description of Change:

(1) This change modifies DS 140A, Small Arms Data Change to revise all DS 140A occurrences of terminology 'Unique Item Identifier (UII)' to 'Serial Number'. This change is necessary to clarify that small arms serial numbers do not comprise a UII under conditions imposed by the DoD Unique Identification (UID) initiative. Historically small arms have been tracked by NSN and serial number. UII will apply in the future for small arms, as UID policy is implemented, but legacy systems are presently using serial numbers for small arms tracking.

(2) This change complements ADC 146, Revision to DLMS Supplement 888A, Small Arms Data Change (Supply). ADC 146 revises DS 888A to change all occurrences of 'UII' to 'Serial Number'. ADC 146 is available at: http://www.dla.mil/j-6/dlmso/eLibrary/Changes/approved.asp.

c. Procedures: Change DLMS Supplement (DS) 140A to Federal Implementation Convention 140A in accordance with (IAW) the following. Additional administrative changes not identified in PDC 156 are identified by highlighted text:

4. REASON FOR CHANGE:

a. Change in terminology is necessary to clarify that small arms serial numbers are not unique item identifier (UIIs). Serial numbers presently used for tracking in the DOD Small Arms Serialization Program (DODSASP) do not comprise a UII under conditions imposed by the DOD Unique Identification (UID) initiative. NOTE: A follow-on ADC will be released to incorporate the UID concept of UII in addition to the serial number.

b. This change complements ADC 146, Revision to DLMS Supplement (DS) 888A, Small Arms Data Change. ADC 146 revisions include clarification that serial numbers as used in DS 888A are not equivalent to UID UIIs. ADC 146 is available at: http://www.dla.mil/j-6/dlmso/eLibrary/Changes/approved.asp.

5. ADVANTAGES and DISADVANTAGES:

a. Advantages: Corrects DS 140A to reflect "SN-Serial Number", rather than unique item identifier (UII). The UII terminology that had been carried in DS 140A prior to this change was comparable to the serial number, and did not equate to a UII under the new DOD UID definition since a serial number lacks "uniqueness" when used alone. Supports DODSASP legacy systems use of serial numbers.

b. Disadvantages: None.
