EXECUTIVE ORDER NO.

ESTABLISHING A CENTRAL INTELLIGENCE SERVICE IN THE EXECUTIVE OFFICE OF THE PRESIDENT AND DEFINING ITS FUNCTIONS AND DUTIES

By virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and the statutes of the United States, including the First War Powers Act, 1941, as President of the United States and as Commander-in-Chief of the Army and Navy, and in order to coordinate and centralize the policies and actions of the Government relating to intelligence, it is hereby ordered as follows:

- an Advisory Board consisting of the Secretary of State, the Secretary of War, the Secretary of the Navy, and such other members as the President may subsequently appoint.

The Board shall advise and assist the Director with respect to the formulation of basic policies and plans of the ______.

- 3. Subject to the direction and control of the President, and with any necessary advice and assistance from the other Departments and agencies of the Government, the _______ shall perform the following functions and duties:
- (a) Coordination of the functions of all intelligence agencies of the Government and the establishment of such intelligence policies and objectives as will assure the integration of national intelligence efforts;
- (b) Final evaluation, synthesis and dissemination within the Government of the intelligence required to enable the Government to determine policies with respect to national planning and security in peace and war, and the advancement of broad national policy;
- (c) Procurement, training and supervision of its intelligence personnel; and
- (d) Such other functions and duties relating to intelligence as the President from time to time may direct.
- 4. The _____ shall have no police or law-enforcement functions, either within or outside the continental limits of the United States.

shall be coordinated with military plans and shall be subject to the approval of the Joint Chiefs of Staff. Parts of such programs which are to be executed in a theater of military operations shall be subject to the control of the Theater Commander.

6. All joint intelligence committees and joint intelligence agencies now operating under the authority of the Joint Chiefs of Staff or the War and Navy Departments are hereby dissolved. The functions, powers, duties, personnel and facilities of such committees and agencies are hereby transferred to the

So much of the unexpended balances of appropriations, allocations or other funds available for the use of any agency in the exercise of any power or duty transferred or consolidated by this Order, or for the use of the head of any agency in the exercise of any power or duty so transferred or consolidated, as the Director of the Bureau of the Budget with the approval of the President shall determine, shall be transferred to the for use in connection with the exercise of powers or duties so transferred or consolidated. In

determining the amount to be transferred, the Director of the Bureau of the Budget may include an amount to provide for the liquidation of obligations incurred against such appropriations, allocations, or other funds prior to the transfer or consolidation.

- 1. Pursuant to Paragraph 3 (d) of Executive
 Order No. , dated , 1944, and
 subject to the limitations in Paragraph 4 thereof,
 the ______ is hereby directed to perform the following functions and duties:
- (a) To collect directly, and through existing
 Departments and agencies of the Government, pertinent information, including military, economic,
 political and scientific, concerning the capabilities,
 intentions and activities of all foreign nations,
 with particular reference to the effect such matters
 may have upon the national security, policies and
 interests of the United States;
- (b) To determine policies for, and to coordinate, facilities essential to the collection of information under subparagraph (a) hereof;
- (c) To conduct subversive operations abroad;and
- (d) To establish and maintain direct liaison with secret intelligence agencies of foreign governments.
- 2. Subject to Paragraph 3 of Executive Order
 No. and Paragraph 1 (a) hereof, existing intelligence agencies within the Government shall collect, evaluate, synthesize and disseminate departmental operating intelligence, herein defined as intelligence required by such agencies in the actual performance of their functions and duties.



shall deliver a certified copy of this directive to the Secretary of State, the Secretary of War, the Secretary of the Navy, the Joint Chiefs of Staff, and the heads of such other Departments and agencies of the Government as may be directly affected by the provisions hereof.
