## Protocols for Changing the Federal Operating Status in DC

- Primary emphasis is weather related however; ALL hazards are considered.
- To facilitate a consistent approach region-wide, coordinate with Federal, State and local authorities for Office of Personnel Management (OPM) to determine the Operating Status of the Federal government across the DC area.
- Individual agencies have the authority to release their employees on a building-by-building basis. (41 CFR 102-74.255 – Facility Management)

## **2012 Incidents Have Included:**

- Icy conditions (January 23)
- Snow (February 8)
- Derecho and aftermath (June 29 July 4)
- Hurricane Sandy (October 28-30)

# Factors and Venue for Situational Awareness

Operating Status decisions are based upon careful weighing of:


- Safety and security of the Federal workforce and National Capital Region community
- Need to maintain Continuity of Government to the maximum extent possible

# **OPM Operating Status Announcements**

#### **DELAYED ARRIVAL**

OPEN — XX hours delayed arrival with option for unscheduled leave or unscheduled telework

NEW: OPEN — DELAYED ARRIVAL: Employees should remain off the roads until XX:XX. Federal offices will open at YY:YY. Employees have the option for unscheduled leave or unscheduled telework.

## **OPM Operating Status Announcements**

#### EARLY DEPARTURE

OPEN — XX hour(s) staggered early departure

OPEN — XX hour(s) staggered early departure "Employees must depart no later than XX:XX at which time Federal offices are CLOSED."

IMMEDIATE DEPARTURE — "Federal offices are CLOSED."

## **OPM Operating Status Announcements**

#### **UNSCHEDULED LEAVE / TELEWORK:**

OPEN — with option for unscheduled leave or unscheduled telework


#### **OTHER:**
