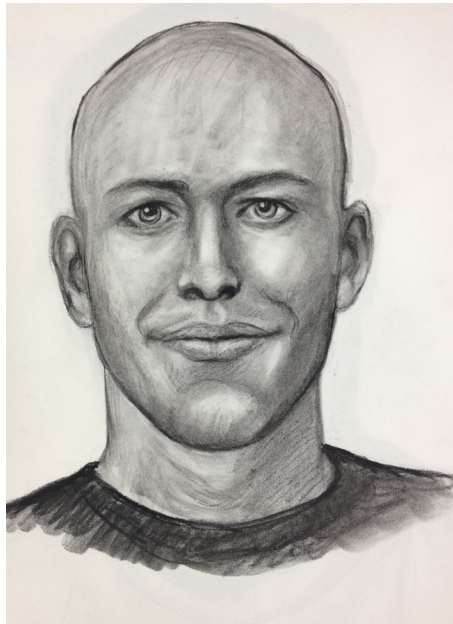

### Army CID seeking information on kidnapping and sexual assault

QUANTICO, VA, October 19, 2012 – Special Agents from the U.S. Army Criminal Investigation Command, commonly known as Army CID, are seeking the public's assistance in connection with an alleged kidnapping and sexual assault of a Fort Benning resident on Oct. 17, at approximately 10 a.m.

The victim was attacked by two male suspects after her vehicle broke down on 101st Airborne Division Road on Fort Benning. The men were reportedly driving a white, 4-door, pickup truck.

After the kidnapping and sexual assault the victim was left at the scene.



The two men, shown in the composite sketches, are wanted for questioning in connection with the alleged kidnapping and sexual assault. The men were last seen in the vicinity of Sunshine Road on Fort Benning.

The man pictured with the shaved head is described as a white male in his twenties about 160 pounds, 5 feet, 9 inches tall with a scar on the left side of his face.

The second man is described as a white male in his thirties, approximately 210 pounds and 5 feet, 9 inches tall. He was last seen wearing a faded baseball cap with the Chevron Oil Company logo.

Army CID is seeking information leading to the identification, arrest and conviction of the person(s) responsible. Individuals wishing to remain anonymous will be honored to the degree allowable under the law, and information will also be held in the strictest confidence allowable under the law.

Agents are asking anyone with information, no matter how trivial it may seem, or who recognize either or both of the individuals in the composite sketch to contact the Fort Benning CID Office at 706-575-8736.

Special Agents are also advising residents to be extra vigilant and report any suspicious activity to CID or the Military Police immediately.
