

## CDC Checklist: Heat Your Home Safely During Winter Weather



<ul> <li>☐ Have at least one of the following heat sources in case the power goes out:         <ul> <li>○ Fireplace with plenty of dry firewood or gas log fireplace</li> <li>○ Portable space heaters or kerosene heaters</li> </ul> </li> <li>☐ Check with your local fire department to make sure that kerosene heaters are legal in your area.</li> </ul>	***
☐ Never place a space heater on top of furniture or near water.	
☐ Use electric space heaters with automatic shut-off switches and nonglowing elements.	
☐ Keep heat sources at least 3 feet away from furniture and drapes.	500
☐ Never leave children unattended near a space heater.	5
☐ Have the following safety equipment:	4

☐ Never use an electric generator indoors, inside the garage, or near the air intake of your home because of the risk of carbon monoxide poisoning: Do not use the generator or appliances if they are wet.	205
☐ Do not store gasoline indoors where the fumes could ignite.	
☐ Use individual heavy-duty, outdoor-rated cords to plug in other appliances.	95
