Commerce Initiates Antidumping and Countervailing Duty Investigations of Certain Standard Steel Fasteners from the People's Republic of China and Taiwan

- On October 14, 2009, the Department of Commerce (Commerce) announced its decision to initiate AD and CVD investigations on imports of certain standard steel fasteners from the People's Republic of China (China) (AD/CVD) and Taiwan (AD).
- Dumping occurs when a foreign company sells a product in the United States at less than normal value. Subsidies are financial assistance from foreign governments that benefit the production, manufacture, or exportation of goods.
- The petitioner for these investigations is Nucor Fastener (IN).
- The products covered by these investigations include certain standard nuts, bolts, and cap screws which are mechanical devices designed to hold, join, couple, assemble, or maintain equilibrium of single or multiple components.
- The products covered by these investigations are currently classified in the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States (HTSUS) under, but not limited to, the following categories: 7318.15.2030, 7318.15.2055, 7318.15.2065, 7318.15.8065, 7318.15.8085, 7318.16.0085. While the HTSUS subheadings are provided for convenience and customs purposes, Commerce's written description of the subject merchandise governs the scope of these investigations.
- From 2006 to 2008, imports of certain standard steel fasteners from China increased by 4.48 percent and were valued at an estimated \$291 million in 2008. Imports from Taiwan over the same time period decreased by 19.09 percent and were valued at an estimated \$395 million in 2008.

NEXT STEPS

- The U.S. International Trade Commission (ITC) is scheduled to make its preliminary injury determination on or about November 9, 2009.
- If the ITC determines that there is a reasonable indication that imports from China and Taiwan are materially injuring, or threatening material injury to, the domestic industry, the investigations will continue, and Commerce will be scheduled to make its CVD preliminary determination in December 2009 and AD preliminary determinations in March 2010.
