Topography: Dissected uplands and small creek floodplain

(Soils) Ashkum silty clay loam, 0 to 2 percent slopes comprises approximately 28 percent of the project area. This soil has a winter to spring water table at 1 foot with ponding of 0.5 feet above the ground surface.

Varna silt loam, 4 to 6 percent slopes, eroded comprises approximately 20 percent of the project area with a perched spring water table from 2 to 3.5 feet. Ozaukee silt loam, 4 to 6 percent slopes, eroded comprises about 16 percent of the project area and has a perched spring water table from 2 to 3.5 feet. Markam silt loam, 4 to 6 percent slopes, eroded comprises about 15 percent of the project area and also has a perched spring water table from 2 to 3.5 feet. Beecher silt loam, 2 to 4 percent slopes, comprises approximately 11 percent of the project area has a winter to spring water table at 0.5 to 2 feet. Elliott silt loam, 2 to 4 percent slopes, comprises approximately 10 percent of the project area and has a perched spring water table from 1 to 2 feet.

The project area is located in the Northern Illinois and Indiana Heavy Till Plain and the soils reflect this with shallow till visible in the profiles of the shovel tests and the creek banks. In general, the soils in the project area are present on toe, back and footslopes of end and ground moraines and consist of a thin mantle of loess over the underlying till. The soils are somewhat to poorly drained, and have somewhat limited to very limited use as camp areas due to seasonally high perched water tables and slow water movement throughout with ponding in Ashkum soils near the creek, as well as in the northeastern section of the project area (Soil Survey Staff 2009).

Drainage: Grant Creek to Des Plaines River

Land Use/Ground Cover (Include % Visibility): Prairie grass, manicured lawn grass, and wooded areas; zero percent visibility.

Survey Limitations: Construction disturbance prohibited survey in the southwest corner of the project area (See Figure 3).

The entire project area had been surveyed in 1988 and 1996 but a new survey was requested due to the fact that two sites in the project area had not had a determination of NRHP eligibility made. David Halpin at the IHPA recommended the current survey concentrate on the two sites with unknown eligibility status (personal communication 2009). The 15 meter grid of shovel tests was used to try to relocate the known sites using current methodology. The area not shovel tested is considered an area of low probability, farther away from the water source on eroded soils that tend to hold water. This area is also a high point on the landscape and would leave any inhabitants exposed whereas the known sites are located on the lower part of a south facing slope, which would have offered protection from winds. In addition, this low probability area has been previously surveyed twice as a plowed field, which provides a more complete view of the ground surface than shovel testing. The areas around the three previously recorded isolated find spots were shovel tested to determine if additional material could be located in those areas. Time Expended: 450 hours

sites/Find Spots Located: One precontact site 11WI3611 consisting of one secondary flake of Galena Chert recovered from shovel test 80, at 60-70 cmbs and one piece of Burlington Chert shatter recovered from shovel test 148 at 20-30 cmbs. One precontact isolated find spot 11WI3612 contained one tertiary flake of Cobdon-Dongola Chert recovered from shovel test 25 at 10-20 cmbs. In addition, one post-contact isolated find spot 11WI3613 consisting of one piece of bright green bottle glass was recovered from shovel test 178 at 0-20 cmbs and disintegrating brick and mortar granules were observed mixed with the A horizon from 17-33 cmbs; however, there were no solid pieces to collect. No archaeological material associated with the previously identified sites was uncovered during the survey.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

During March and April of 2009, The 106 Group Ltd. (106 Group) conducted a Phase I archaeological survey for the proposed Abraham Lincoln National Cemetery Expansion project in Will County, Illinois. The United States Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) proposes to expand the existing Abraham Lincoln National Cemetery to include an additional 70 acres near Elwood, Will County Illinois (Figure 1). The survey was conducted under contract with JJR, LLC on behalf of the VA. The proposed Abraham Lincoln National Cemetery (ALNC) Expansion project will be receiving federal funding and/or permitting from the VA and, therefore, must comply with Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966, as amended, and other applicable state mandates governing cultural resources. The purpose of this archaeological survey was to determine whether the project area contains previously recorded or unrecorded archaeological sites that may be *potentially* eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places (NRHP).

The area of potential effect (APE) for archaeology accounts for any areas of ground disturbance and/or construction related activities. For the proposed ALNC Expansion project, the archaeological APE was determined to be the same as the project area, which is located in Section 31, T34N, R10E, in Will County, Illinois and covers 70 acres (28.33 hectares). This Phase I archaeological investigation consisted of a review of historic maps; a review of site files to identify previously recorded sites and reports for surveys previously conducted within the APE on file at the Illinois State Museum Research and Collections Center in Springfield, Illinois; as well as a field survey to relocate any previously recorded sites and identify and document any additional cultural material observed within the APE. Kristen J. Bastis, M.A., RPA, served as principal investigator for archaeology.

RESULTS

Literature Review

The results of the review of the GIS database, site files, and previous reports at the Illinois State Museum Research and Collections Center indicated that the entire project area had been surveyed in 1988 and 1996 and that five archaeological sites and three isolated finds were previously recorded within the current APE (Atchison and Lurie 1996; Lurie et al. 1990; Jeske et al. 1988; Figure 2; Table 1). This research did not identify site numbers or associated site forms for Isolated Tools 1, 5, and 6 within the project area. The locations of Isolated Tools 1, 5, and 6 were determined from a map presented in two previous reports (Lurie et al. 1990, Figure 2, p3; Jeske et al. 1988, Figure 4, p25). A review of the 1827 and 1834 plat maps online depicted no structures within the current project area (Figures 3 and 4; Illinois State Archives 2009). In addition, plat maps available from the Illinois State Library Map Department in Springfield, Illinois depicted no structures within the project area (Ogle and Company 1893 and 1909; Rockford Map Publishers 1948 and 1953; Sidwell Studio 1961; Thompson Brothers 1873; and Hixson 1937). The 1873 plat map shows members of the Grant Family owning most of the current project area with M. Morgan owning the south half of section 31 (Thompson Brothers 1873; Figure 5). A structure is depicted on the Grant land to the northeast of the current project

area in the path of Route 53. Members of the Morgan Family owned the project area from 1893-1937 (Ogle and Company 1893 and 1909; and Hixson 1937; Figure 6). The Morgans retained the structure the Grants had used and between 1902 and 1909 built a structure on Diagonal Road to the west of the project area (see Figure 2). Only school, churches and cemeteries are depicted on the 1937 plat map (Hixson 1937). The United States Government is shown as the landowner from 1948-1961 and no structures or roads are depicted (Rockford Map Publishers 1948 and 1953; Sidwell Studio 1961). Various agencies of the United States Government are known to be the landowner from 1948 through the present (Rockford Map Publishers 1948 and 1953; Sidwell Studio 1961; Mark 2009; Figure 7).

Site 11-WI-287 was recorded as RDX-7 in 1988 by Midwest Archaeological Research Services (MARS) as a small lithic scatter in a wooded area at the bottom of a slope just north of Grant Creek. No determination of eligibility for listing on the NRHP was made in 1988. In 1990 MARS surveyed RDX-7 (Site 11-WI-287) and found no additional material. The site was recommended not eligible for listing on the NRHP (Atchison and Lurie 1996; Lurie et. al 1990).

Site 11-WI-519 was recorded as G-1 in 1990 and is attributed to the Early Archaic Period, as one Fox Valley and one Kirk Corner Notched point were recovered from the site (Lurie et. al 1990; Lurie 1990a). It is unclear from the reporting or the site form available if this site was recommended for further testing. In 1996, the status of Site 11-WI-519 is listed as "in question" (Atchison and Lurie 1996). In their 1996 report Atchison and Lurie state the site's eligibility for listing on the NRHP is "in question" (Atchison and Lurie 1996).

Site 11-WI-520 was recorded as G-2 in 1990 as a post-contact Euro-American site consisting of mid to late 19th century cultural material. The site was recommended as potentially eligible for listing on the NRHP (Atchison and Lurie 1996; Lurie et. al 1990; Lurie 1990b). The site form on file indicates a structure is depicted on the Ogle 1909 plat map within the boundaries of the site; however, the structure is farther to the north, within the boundaries of Site 11-WI-519, reported as an Early Archaic site (see Figure 2). It is unclear from the reporting or the site form available if this site was recommended for further testing. In 1996, the status of Site 11-WI-520 is listed as "in question" (Atchison and Lurie 1996).

Site 11-WI-521 was recorded as RDX-7 Central in 1990 by MARS as a small lithic scatter on the slope of a cultivated field approximately 70 meters northwest of Grant Creek (Lurie et. al 1990;

Lurie 1990c). The site was determined not eligible for listing on the NRHP (Atchison and Lurie 1996; Lurie et. al 1990).

Site 11-WI-522 was recorded as RDX-7 West in 1990 by MARS as a small lithic scatter on the slope of a cultivated field at the edge of a wooded area approximately 90 meters northwest of Grant Creek (Lurie et. al 1990; Lurie 1990d). In 1990 the site was recommended as not eligible for listing on the NRHP. However, in 1996 Site 11-WI-522 was re-surveyed by MARS and at that time the portion of the site that extended into the wooded area was not tested and a recommendation regarding NRHP eligibility was deferred until after the completion of the additional testing (Atchison and Lurie 1996).

Archaeological Survey

A reconnaissance walk over was used to ground truth areas of disturbance from previous construction and landscaping activities in the project area. David Halpin at the IHPA recommended the current survey concentrate on the sites (11-WI-519, 11-WI-520, and 11-WI-522) whose NRHP eligibility had not been previously determined (personal communication 2009). A grid of shovel tests at a 15 meter interval was used in the high probability areas including any known sites. The area around the reported location of three previously identified isolated finds were shovel tested at 5 meter intervals until two consecutive negative shovel tests were excavated in each direction where the soils had not been disturbed by previous construction. As a result of the current investigation, one precontact site (11-WI-3611), one precontact isolated find spot (11-WI-3612), and one isolated post-contact find spot (11-WI-3613) were recorded (Figure 8; Table 2). Site 11-WI-287 was not tested due to previous disturbance by the existing pipeline and utility corridors (Figures 8 and 9). The portion of Site 11-WI-519 within the current project boundaries was not tested due to disturbance by previous construction of the Abraham Lincoln National Cemetery and the associated water and drainage infrastructure (Figures 8, 10, and 11). Sites 11-WI-520, 11-WI-521, and 11-WI-522 were shovel tested at 15 meter intervals in an attempt to re-identify the sites (Figures 8, 12, 13, and 14). According to the site location provided on the site form, current testing at Site 11-WI-522 included the wooded portion of the site not previously tested in 1990. No additional material was recovered within the recorded boundaries of these three sites (see Figure 8). Radials at 5 meter intervals were excavated in the four cardinal directions around the recorded locations of Isolated Tools 1, 5, and 6; however, no additional cultural material was recovered (Figures 8, 15 and 16).

Table 3 summarizes the material recovered during the current survey by location. Site 11-WI-3611 consists of one secondary flake of Galena Chert (ST 80, 60-70 cmbs) and one piece of Burlington Chert shatter (ST 148, 20-30 cmbs). Site 11-WI-3612 consisted of a tertiary flake of Cobdon-Dongola Chert material (ST 25, 10-20 cmbs). Site 11-WI-3613 consists of one bright green bottle glass shard and a stain of disintegrating brick and mortar observed in one shovel test (ST 178, 0-20 cmbs). No foundations, depressions, or other features indicating a structure were

observed within the project area (Atchison and Lurie 1996). Radials were excavated at 5 meter intervals in the four cardinal directions around each positive shovel test and no additional material was recovered.

Approximately 1.5 acres (0.6 hectares) of the project area is under construction and was disturbed prior to the current survey (Figure 17). A low density scatter of early 20th century material was observed along the northern edge of the area disturbed by the construction (Figure 18; see Figure 8).

RECOMMENDATIONS

Sites 11-WI-3611, 11-WI-3612 and 11-WI-3613 and previously identified Isolated Tools 1, 5, and 6 are not eligible for listing on the NRHP due to the lack of diagnostic material and/or associated features that would provide data to answer significant research questions. The portion of Site 11-WI-519 within the current project boundaries has been disturbed by construction related to the existing cemetery and, therefore, is recommended as a non-contributing element of Site 11-WI-519, should the remainder of the site, located outside the current APE, be determined eligible for the NRHP (Table 4). Despite the excavation of a 15 meter grid of shovel tests within the recorded site boundaries of three previously recorded sites, no material was observed on the surface or recovered from the testing of site 11-WI-520, 11-WI-521, or 11-WI-522. Site 11-WI-287 was previously recommended as not eligible for listing on the NRHP.




Federal Township Plat Jackson Township 1827

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

Combination Atlas Map of Will County Jackson Township 1873



