Graded Agency:

The Department's small business achievements can be attributed to the agency's commitment and activities, which include OSDBU participation in local and national trade association outreach events, procurement conferences, vendor matchmaking sessions and Congressional small business – focused events. DOT will continue to demonstrate a commitment to enhance opportunities for all small businesses and strengthen accountability and transparency.

In FY2010 the DOT OSDBU Small Business Task Force continued to grow in relevance within the Department. Chaired by the DOT OSDBU Director, the Small Business Task Force which is comprised of the Secretary of Transportation, DOT Deputy Secretary, Heads of each Operating Administration, and the Offices of General Counsel, Civil Rights, Transportation Policy, and Government Affairs, continues to address the challenges and commitment to utilize small businesses in DOT contracting opportunities.

The DOT OSDBU office implemented a quarterly roundtable which emphasizes SDVOSB. This roundtable group consists of SBS, CO and other program officials looking at small business efforts to enhance SDVOSB opportunities. Our SDVOSB efforts have increased each year, positioning DOT close to the SDVOSB goal. DOT continues to work with SBA to ensure opportunities for all small businesses. DOT is committed to finding innovative ways to strengthen and catapult small businesses to the next level, so they can create jobs and continue to drive our economy.

SBA:

The Department of Transportation (DOT) met 3 of its 5 prime contracting goals: Women Owned Small Business, Small Disadvantaged Business and HUBZone. However, it did not meet its prime contracting goals for Small Business and Service-Disabled Veteran Owned Small Business.

Fiscal year 2010 prime contracting achievement saw increases over FY2009 in Small Disadvantaged Business and Service-Disabled Veteran Owned Small Business. DOT FY2010 achievement declined for Small Business, Women Owned Small Business and HUBZone.

DOT regularly attends Small Business Procurement Advisory Council meetings.
