Graded Agency:

The Social Security Administration (SSA) is pleased with the improvement in its SBA Small Business Scorecard. The improvement in our grade reflects the hard work, dedication, and commitment of agency personnel to the small business programs. Our acquisition workforce continuously seeks opportunities to meet or exceed the scorecard performance elements. We advocate for and promote the small business programs with all our customers. In addition, agency senior management has communicated its support for the small business program to all our personnel.

Some of our accomplishments include:

- Our Office of Small and Disadvantaged Business Utilization (OSDBU) conducts monthly outreach briefings with small businesses seeking contracting opportunities with SSA.
- The OSDBU sponsors an annual Procurement Fair and is planning a future matchmaking event for small business to meet and network with our agency's largest contractors.
- The \$442 million in obligated dollars to contracts owned by small business is the highest amount in SSA's history of supporting the program.
- We achieved the statutory goal for service-disabled veteran-owned small businesses.
- Our fiscal year 2010 prime contracting achievement represented increases of \$8 million for women-owned small businesses and \$77 million for small disadvantaged business.

SBA:

The Social Security Administration (SSA) met 3 of its 5 prime contracting goals: Small Business, Small Disadvantaged Business and Service-Disabled Veteran Owned Small Business. However, it did not meet its prime contracting goals for Woman Owned Small Business and HUBZone.

Fiscal year 2010 prime contracting achievement saw increases over FY2009 in Women Owned Small Business, Small Disadvantaged Business, Service-Disabled Veteran Owned Small Business and HUBZone. SSA FY2010 achievement declined for Small Business.

SSA occasionally attends Small Business Procurement Advisory Council meetings.
