How can Benefits.gov help you?

What can you expect to find?

Here are just a few benefits for which you may be eligible:

- The Head Start program (for children ages 3-5) and Early Head Start program (for pregnant women, infants and toddlers) promote school readiness for children in low-income families by providing comprehensive educational, health, nutritional, and social services.
- Hope for Homeowners is a new program for people at risk of losing their home due to default and foreclosure. The program provides new, 30-year, fixed rate mortgages that are insured by the Federal Housing Administration (FHA). Homeowners having difficulty paying their mortgages may be eligible to refinance into a mortgage that they can afford. Hope for Homeowners is voluntary and both lender(s) and homeowner(s) must agree to participate.
- The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009
 contains COBRA premium assistance provisions that expand
 COBRA eligibility and provide eligible individuals with a 65
 percent reduction of their COBRA premiums for up to 9 months. If
 eligible, these individuals pay only 35 percent of their COBRA
 premiums to the plan and the remaining 65 percent is paid by the
 employer through a payroll tax credit.
