Steps for Doing Business with SBO

- 1. Make yourself known in the Federal procurement arena. Email, call, or schedule a visit to meet with an ESG Small Business Specialist to discuss your capabilities
- 2. Register your capabilities and experience with the System for Award Management www.sam.gov (SAM). SAM is a free website that consolidates the capabilities you used to find in Central Contractor Registration (CCR), Online Reps and Certs (ORCA), and Excluded Parties List Systems (EPLS). Future phases of SAM will add the capabilities of other systems used in federal procurement and award processes. Note: If you had an active record in CCR, you have an active record in SAM. You do not have to do anything in SAM unless there has been a change in your business's circumstances.
- 3. Complete all other registrations:

Contractor and Government Entity Code Dun & Bradstreet Wide Area Workflow North American Industry Classification Codes Data Universal Numbering System

- 4. For Federal Business Opportunities go to FedBizOpps for information on proposed procurements exceeding \$25,000. FedBizOpps lists awards of contracts by DoD of \$100,000 or more, as well as all federal contract awards of \$50,000 or more for potential subcontracting opportunities. - 5. Be alert for announcements of conferences, trade fairs, and other federally attended or sponsored industrial liaison meetings in your area.
- 6. Participate in Market Research by responding to: requests for information (RFIs), follow-up questionnaires or requests for site visits, and Sources Sought Synopses. Attend Industry Days. Your responses are important to ESG and can affect our acquisition strategy.
