FCC and NTIA Roles





Federal Communications Commission - Regulates all non-Federal Government spectrum.

The Legislative Branch telecommunications policy maker, and the Congress's principal adviser on telecommunications policy.






National Telecommunications and Information Administration - Regulates all Federal Government spectrum use.

The Executive Branch telecommunications policy maker, and the President's principal adviser on telecommunications policy.

Section 7.3.3 Deployment of Spectrum Dependent Systems

Use of US, USA, USP, Statewide and other area assignments.

A Federal Agency must notify NTIA that they are being used and coordinate the use of the assignments in a disaster area.

Additional coordination is required for US, USA, USP, Statewide and other area assignments when use of these frequencies falls within a DoD Area Frequency Coordinator's (AFC) area of responsibility.





Section 7.3.6 Emergency Use of Non-Federal Frequencies

Conditions for use:

- Verbal or written concurrence from the licensee.
- Must operate under the conditions of the FCC rules.
- Must operate under the conditions of the licensee's license.
- Must terminate operations when directed by the licensee.
- Operations must not exceed 60 days.
- Federal Agency's must submit a report through the IRAC Frequency Assignment Subcommittee each time Part 90 frequencies are used.







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
