## JOBS SUPPORTED BY EXPORTS: AN UPDATE

$>$ The U.S. Department of Commerce estimates that in 2011 jobs supported by exports increased to 9.7 million, up 1.2 million since 2009 (see Figure 1).
$>$ For the first time in U.S. history, annual exports of goods and services crossed the $\$ 2$ trillion threshold, exceeding $\$ 2.1$ trillion in 2011.
$>$ In 2011, exports of U.S. goods and services were up 34 percent from 2009 (see Figure 2).
> In 2011, every billion dollars of U.S. exports supported 5,080 jobs.
$>$ Projected jobs supported by exports for 2011 use newly released data from the Bureau of Labor Statistics.
