Technical Assistance Program

- Our technical assistance program has provided support to various economies in the following areas:
 - the drafting of competition laws and regulations;
 - design of enforcement agencies;
 - education of supporting institutions both inside and outside of government; and
 - training of personnel in substantive legal principles, analytical framework, and investigative techniques.





Creating an Effective Competition Enforcement Authority

- After the agency is in place, its staff benefits from training in how to apply the law. This includes:
 - how to conduct investigations;
 - how to select appropriate cases;
 - how to shape prosecutions; and
 - how to craft remedies.
- Our inherent strength as antitrust enforcement agencies is in assisting staff to develop the skills necessary to perform these and other necessary tasks.





Program Methods

- The FTC/DOJ delivers its technical assistance through several different types of programs, primarily:
 - long-term resident advisors;
 - short-term missions (one-two weeks),
 including investigative techniques
 conferences; and
 - study visits by foreign personnel in the United States.
