# STUDY IN THE STATES (SitS) Fact Sheet

#### MISSION:

- Study in the States was a website launched September 16, 2011 as a part of DHS Secretary Napolitano's academic engagement initiative to encourage the best and brightest international students to study and learn about post-graduate opportunities in the United States.
- Study in the States is an online information hub that uses innovate ways to connect international students and the academic community to information they need from all of the government agencies involved in the international student process. Much of the content on Study in the States is generated by the Student & Exchange Visitor Program (SEVP), but the website is part of a U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS)-wide initiative.

#### **KEY CONTENT:**

- Other DHS component agencies that are featured on SitS include: U.S.
   Citizenship & Immigration Services (USCIS) and Customs and Border Protection (CBP), as well as the Department of State.
  - Study in the States provides high level information for every step of the international student process then directs visitors to the appropriate agency for additional resources.
  - For example, the Study in the States 'Here to Help' series provides additional information on these agencies and a front-line perspective for international students to know what they can expect when they interact with each of them.

#### **KEY FEATURES:**

- Study in the States incorporates interactive features to facilitate the mission of serving as an online informational hub for international students.
  - Searchable database of schools: users can find an SEVP certified school by searching the database by school name, city, or state
  - Study Guide to the States: an interactive guide provides a high level overview of the entire international student lifecycle, directing students to resources and information on each step of the international student process

 Language Translation: Study in the States will allow the user to instantly translate resource pages into the top languages for international students studying in the United States.
