



Possession of Firearms and Other Dangerous Weapons on Postal Service Property Is Prohibited by Law

Possessing a firearm or other dangerous weapon in a federal facility for other than official purposes, causing such a weapon to be present, or attempting to do so are punishable by a fine, imprisonment for up to 1 year, or both.

If the prohibited weapon is intended to be used to commit a crime, the penalty is an increased fine, imprisonment for up to 5 years, or both.

Title 18, *United States Code*, Section 930

No person on U.S. Postal Service property may carry or store firearms, explosives, or other dangerous or deadly weapons, either openly or concealed, except for official purposes.

Title 39, *Code of Federal Regulations*, Section 232.1
