February 10, 1973

Henry Kissinger traveled to Hanoi

February 12, 1973

George Shultz announced a 10% devaluation of the dollar

First group of US prisoners of war (POWs) return in accordance with the Vietnam cease-fire

February 21, 1973

Israeli Air Force shot down a Libyan Arab Airways Boeing 727 passenger jet

February 28, 1973

Native Americans began occupation of Wounded Knee, South Dakota

March 1, 1973

Golda Meir visited the White House

March 2, 1973

Black September members killed two US diplomats in Khartoum, Sudan

Declaration of International Conference on Vietnam signed in Paris

March 21, 1973

John Dean told the President in the Oval Office that there was a "Cancer on the Presidency"

March 29, 1973

Final US troops left Vietnam
