#### Number, Race, and Sex of Perpetrators

The number of persons known to be involved in the 6,957 robberies, burglaries, and larcenies was 8,480. The following table shows a breakdown of the 8,480 persons who have been identified by race and sex. In a small number of cases, the use of full disquise makes determination of race and sex impossible.

Investigation to date has resulted in the identification of 4,520 (53%) of the 8,480 persons known to be involved. Of these 4,520 identified persons, 1763 (39%) were determined to be users of narcotics, and 814 (18%) were found to have been previously convicted in either federal or state court for bank robbery, bank burglary, or bank larceny.

#### Injuries, Deaths, and Hostages Taken

Acts of violence were committed during 310 (4.5%) of the 6,957 robberies, burglaries, and larcenies which occurred during this 12-month period. These acts included 72 instances involving the discharge of firearms, 218 instances involving assaults, and 30 instances of hostage situations. (One or more acts of violence may occur during an incident.) These acts of violence resulted in 141 injuries, 21 deaths, and 70 persons being taken hostage.
