


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

OUTSTANDING STORMS OF THE MONTH

1. EARLY SEASON NOR'EASTER STRIKES THE NORTHEAST


An early season "nor'easter" developed off the coast of North Carolina on December 19. As the storm approached the New Engalnd coast, the central barometric pressure had fallen to 28.94 inches (980 millibars) and was supported by a strong upper level closed low. By December 21, The cnetral barometric pressure had dropped to 28.70 inches (972 millibars) and was centered between Maine and Nova Scotia. Snow totals in Boston exceeded 11 inches and with wind gusts of 41 miles per hour, drifting snow was a problem.


Very strong downslope winds gusting to 100 mph (87 kts) knocked down trees and power lines triggering 800 power outages. Downed power lines sparked a half dozen brush fires ranging up to four acres in size. In addition, part of an old drive-in movie screen in Boulder was blown over, several car windows were blown out and the roof was nearly blown off the Fraser Post Office. A few of the locations reporting the strongest wind gusts included: Golden Gate Canyon (87 kts), Rocky Flats Environmental Technology Site (86 kts), North Boulder (83 kts), Wondervu and Berthoud Pass (82 kts), Conifer (70 kts), South Boulder (67 kts) and Rustic (61 kts).


A strengthening low pressure system moved southeast through eastern Colorado and into north Texas by Southern Mountains evening. Four to six inches of snow generally occurred in parts of the south central mountains and Northern San Luis northern San Luis Valley. Ten inches fell near Cuchara, in Huerfano County, and around six inches Valley/Pueblo and near Rye in Pueblo County. Four inches fell in Woodland Park in Teller County. Lesser amounts Eastern Fremont occurred elsewhere in southeast Colorado.


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
