## Representative Pricey Harrison

Representative Pricey Harrison is in her fifth term representing the citizens of Guilford County in the NC House of Representatives. Her terms have been defined by her championing issues relating to the environment, energy, consumer protection, ethics, and justice.

In her fifth term, Rep. Harrison has continued her leadership on energy, environment, and economic development issues. She was the past co-chair of the Appropriations Subcommittee on Natural and Economic Resources. She also served as Co-Chair of the Environmental Review Commission and the Committee on Environment and Natural Resources. The NC League of Conservation Voters awarded Representative Harrison the 2012 Defender of the Environment award.

Representative Harrison has dedicated more than 30 years of her life to improving the quality of life for the citizens of North Carolina. She has served on boards of organizations such as National Caucus of Environmental Legislators, the NC and national boards of Environmental Defense Fund, the Julian Price Family Foundation, the Piedmont Land Conservancy, The Nature Conservancy; The UNC Law School Association the UNC Institute of the Environment; The Duke Marine Lab; and the Southern Environmental Law Center.

Pricey is a native of Greensboro, and graduated from Duke University and the University of North Carolina Law School.
