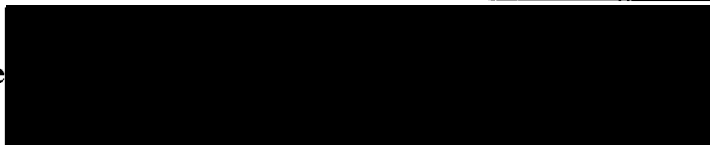

Representative Pricey Harrison is in her fifth term representing the citizens of Guilford County in the NC House of Representatives. Her terms have been defined by her championing issues relating to the environment, energy, consumer protection, ethics, and justice.

In her fifth term, Rep. Harrison has continued her leadership on energy, environment, and economic development issues. She was the past co-chair of the Appropriations Subcommittee on Natural and Economic Resources. She also served as Co-Chair of the Environmental Review Commission and the Committee on Environment and Natural Resources. In addition she serves or has served on House Energy and Energy Efficiency, Judiciary, Election Law, Public Utilities, Regulatory Reform, and Marine Resources Committees.

She has received legislative advocacy awards from the following organizations: The North Carolina Wildlife Federation; Conservation Council of NC; the North Carolina chapter of NOW; the American Lung Association; NC Sustainable Energy Association; The People of Faith Against the Death Penalty; El Pueblo; Common Cause; Women's Action for a New Direction; the Greensboro Chapter of ARC; Alliance for Appalachia; and the North Carolina Justice Center. Also, Rep. Harrison received the Legislator of the Year Award from the 2009 Governor's Conservation Achievement Award Council. She was recently awarded the Accomplished Alumna Award from her Alma Mater, the Emma Willard School. She was awarded the James Dockery Environmental Leadership Award from the Southern Environmental Law Center [and the Lillian's List Courage Award in 2011](#). The NC League of Conservation Voters awarded Representative Harrison the 2012 Defender of the Environment award.

Representative Harrison has dedicated more than 30 years of her life to improving the quality of life for the citizens of North Carolina. She has served on boards of organizations such as National Caucus of Environmental Legislators, the NC and national boards of Environmental Defense Fund, the Julian Price Family Foundation, the Piedmont Land Conservancy, The Nature Conservancy; The UNC Law School Association the UNC Institute of the Environment; The Duke Marine Lab; and the Southern Environmental Law Center.

Pricey is a native of Greensboro, and graduated from Duke University and the University of North Carolina Law School.
