Dear National Fire Academy Student:

Congratulations on your acceptance into the U.S. Fire Administration's National Fire Academy's Communications for Emergency Services Success course. This is a 2-week course designed to enhance your communication skills. During the course, two subject areas are covered in depth: written and oral communication.

Week 1, Written Communication, provides the requisite knowledge and skills for effective written communication. Writing workshops are designed to study common writing problems, drawing on fire department materials as illustrations. Group and individual evaluation of selected assignment papers submitted by participants is an important feature of the class study.

Week 2, Oral Communication, provides practical and theoretical concepts of effective oral communication, emphasizing public speaking skills. Oral presentations by participants are evaluated by the individual, other participants, and the instructor.

This course includes an on-line computer-based instructional methodology that must be completed **prior to** attending class at the National Fire Academy. The software is called Skills Tutor (language and writing), which is a self-directed tutorial that will enhance your competency. Please refer to the document listed at http://www.usfa.fema.gov/training/nfa/pre-course/ for instruction on completion of this pre-course requirement.

End-of-class graduation ceremonies are an important part of the course and you are expected to attend. Please do not make any travel arrangements to leave campus until after you and your classmates graduate.

Increasing numbers of students and instructors are bringing laptop computers to campus. You alone are responsible for the security and maintenance of your equipment. The Academy cannot provide you with computer software, hardware, or technical support to include disks, printers, scanners, etc. There is a limited number of 120 Volt AC outlets in the classrooms. A Student Computer Lab is located in Building D and is available for all students to use. It is open daily with technical support provided in the evenings. This lab uses Windows XP and Office 2007 as the software standard.

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Dear Communications for Emergency Services Success Course Student:

The United States Fire Administration's National Fire Academy (USFA/NFA) is making the webbased Skills Tutor Writing and Language tutorial available on-line for students to complete before attending the *Communications for Emergency Services Success* Course. We would appreciate your help in assisting us work through this system by taking the course before you attend the class. We encourage you to use the system so we can address any problems that may occur. However, if you do not complete the requirement before arriving at the NFA, you may continue to work on the materials while you are on campus.

The requirement is that you achieve an **85** percent passing score on each of 8 final exams (one final exam for each of the four modules in Language and the four modules in Writing). We suggest that you complete the Language portion of the requirement first, then the Writing portion. You can go directly to the exams or you can take the lessons or any combination of both. You can keep taking the final exams until you achieve passing scores. The average time of completion for the entire assignment is 20 hours or more.

Requirements for Skills Tutor
