





recently visited your property and would like to inform you he following:
Ground Survey/Tree Climbers have completed a survey of your property and have NOT found signs of the ALB; however, future surveys will be required.
Ground Survey/Tree Climbers have completed a survey of your property and have found a POSITIVE tree(s) on your property.
Ground Survey/Tree Climbers have completed a survey of your property and have found a SUSPICIOUS tree(s) on your property. Your tree(s) will be rechecked in the near future.
We will begin the removal of infested trees on your property between (date) and (date). The restoration of your property will be conducted after removals, but may be delayed due to weather and/or soil conditions. Property restoration includes the grinding or herbicide treatment of the infested tree's stump followed by returning the property to grade, seeding landscape areas and repairing damage to properties caused by removal operations.

SURVEY IN PROGRESS

Ohio ALB Cooperative Eradication Program staff from the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service and the Ohio Department of Agriculture are currently surveying Asian longhorned beetle (ALB) host trees on this property for signs of infestation.

We also need your help to stop the spread of this tree-killing, invasive pest. One of the most common ways ALB and other exotic pests can spread into new areas is by people unintentionally moving infested plant materials. To prevent this from happening, please do not move firewood or ALB host material, such as cut wood, stumps, or host trees, from the infested areas.
