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Couples / Relationships

In even the best of relationships, conflicts arise that can lead to patterns of behavior resulting in emotional or psychological abuse, economic control, and/or interference with personal liberty and the use of force against a person of the opposite sex.

The Family Advocacy Program (FAP) provides educational information, resources, and services to assist anyone that may be a victim of violence, an offender in an abusive relationship, or a person impacted by violence.

Unit Education & Training:

Family Violence Awareness (required annually by AR-608-18 for troops) is a 2-hour education program on the dynamics and cycle of Family violence, reporting procedures, and resources.



Couples Communication:

Teaches skills to enhance any relationship by using effective communication methods.

Life in Balance-How to Manage Stress

A workshop that teaches skills to resist or cope with stresses and how to management conflict and anger.

Victim Advocate:

On call 24/7, provides support to the abused individual and offers a full range of safety services to victims of domestic violence about their rights as a victim, protection orders, legal advocacy, and/or referrals to a safe, protective shelter when necessary.

Sexual Assault Prevention & Training:

Sexual Assault Prevention and Training helps to eliminate incidents of sexual assault through awareness, education, victim advocacy, reporting, response, and follow-up.

Victim Advocate services are also provided for victims of sexual assault, providing support during investigative, medical, and legal proceedings, Command liaison services, and more.

Parenting

Parenting is one of the greatest challenges a person can undertake. While it can be the greatest joy of your life, it can also be stressful and tiring, especially to new parents. When the military life style is added to the mix, parenting can be more than overwhelming.

The New Parent Support Program (NPSP) offers services to all



parents from pregnancy through the time your child is 5 years old. We help strengthen parenting knowledge and skills so children have an environment where they can thrive. Programs and classes for parents include:

Parenting Classes:

Scream Free Parenting (parents with children ages 1-4)

Before Baby Arrives -(for parents and their unborn child)

Baby Bootcamp for Dads (expectant or new fathers)

Infant Massage (Babies 6 wks. to 9 mos.)



Home Visits:

No need to pack up the kids, our caring and knowledgeable NPSP team visits homes upon request to answer questions on feeding, behavior, growth & development.

Play Group:

Music, games, and fun for little ones and their parents. Lots of toys & happy noise with delightful Army girls and boys!
