- 1. Data from the Federal Procurement Data System Next Generation (FPDS-NG) indicates that the Federal Trade Commission has not purchased products manufactured outside of the United States. FPDS-NG is the automated on-line data system established by the Federal Procurement Data Center (FPDC) which collects historical and statistical information about the government's procurement contracts. - 2. No waivers have been granted with respect to such articles, materials or supplies under the Buy America Act (41 USC 10(a) et seq.).
- 3. The FPDS system does not provide a report which separates funds spent on manufactured goods from funds spent on services, so we are unable to identify total funds spent on manufactured goods. But in accordance with the above, none of these funds are reported as having been spent on goods manufactured outside of the United States.
