## Federal Trade Commission Buy American Act Report for Fiscal Year 2007 (Per Consolidated Appropriations Act, Public Law 109-115)

- 1. Data from the Federal Procurement Data System Next Generation (FPDS-NG) indicates that the Federal Trade Commission has not purchased products manufactured outside of the United States. FPDS-NG is the automated on-line data system established by the Federal Procurement Data Center (FPDC) which collects historical and statistical information about the government's procurement contracts. - 2. There were no waivers granted with respect to such articles, materials or supplies under the Buy American Act (41 USC 10(a) et seq.).
