This letter is being written on behalf of [REDACTED] who is presently applying for funds under the Rural Utility Service's Broadband Infrastructure Program (BIP). Since Praxis may file under a different corporate entity to meet carrier requirements, please regard this letter to be in support of their endeavor, irrespective of a new corporate name.

Several years ago, the Tule River Reservation Tribal Council asked Praxis to help obtain grant funds to develop a fiber optic network on tribal land here in Porterville, California. At the time, portions of the Reservation did not have telephone service and high speed internet was available nowhere.


Praxis took on the task. They researched grant programs and, on our behalf, wrote and successfully obtained funding from both the CPUC Rural Telecommunications Infrastructure Grants Program and the RUS's Community Connect Broadband Program. The federal and state programs were then integrated into one, completely integrated project for both broadband and telephony.

Once funded, they designed the fiber-to-the-premises (FTTP) network, coordinated interconnection with AT&T and the power company (pole attachments), negotiated and engaged suppliers, installed facilities including conduit, buildings and cable, electronics, and successfully commissioned the network. They also created an administrative system to manage the network and provided a full accounting of project financials.

In short, they created an end-to-end solution for over 300 residences and buildings on over 57,000 acres of tribal land. The network was constructed on time and under budget. It was the first project to complete in California and we were informed that it had the lowest per-unit fiber costs of all.

We believe Praxis's work on this project is exemplary of applicants working on public grants programs. They performed their tasks competently and with a high level of integrity. Please consider our input as you review their projects.

Thank you for your inquiry regarding the Marine Corps Mountain Warfare Training Center's (MCMWTC) opinion of Mono County's Digital 395 Project. The MCMWTC supports the Digital 395 Project and feels that it would be of benefit to both our mission and to the quality of life available to our personnel. As we understand it, the fiber optical network or path that will be laid out would be the most advanced in terms of land wiring with comparison to our current fiber, copper, and wireless networks, both here at our training installation in Pickel Meadows and at our base housing complex in Coleville.


The cost of 84.5 million dollars for a green field (where there is no current conduit) and fiber over lay (upgrading current conduit) project would likely pay for itself considering fiber's many applications such as Video Streaming, Voice Over Internet Protocol, Broadband Data, etc. These features would give the community and MCMWTC a technological advancement because of the speed in which fiber operates. Copper cannot match its bandwidth.

Under this project, we would also have the option of rerouting traffic from one substation or central office to another. The solution we require and that this initiative could lead to from a communications stand point is to have a SONET ring implemented at the MCMWTC, assuring us a constant, secure communications network even if there is an outage. This would be the most effective means of a secure network available.

Finally, as we understand it, the Digital 395 Project is green technology because fiber does not require grounding and bonding, copper, lead cables, and lead sheathing to protect such cables, which omit lead particles that are a OSHA Hazardous Materials concern. Also, fiber-optics are not susceptible to electromagnetic issues such as arcing.

For all of these reasons, our assessment is that the Digital 395 Project would be an enhancement to our community and to our mission. I appreciate the opportunity to comment on this important initiative. As always, we cherish our close working relationship with the County and its residents.
