9. Please describe any best practices / lessons learned that can be shared with other similar BTOP projects (900 words or less).

We have learned to be flexible and adaptable with the delays that our project has experienced because of a very late legislative approval. We have engaged in activities that would prepare us to fully implement the program on our compressed timetable. We have attended all of the BTOP training possible, we have offered introductory training and outreach to the library staff in the libraries that will participate as PCCs. We have created a website and commissioned a logo for our project, which we've dubbed Alaska OWL (Online with Libraries). We've drawn up the RFP that will be the basis of the bandwidth improvement aspect of our our project. We are prepared to hire staff and sign letters of agreement with our partners and libraries, and we've put together a small library advisory committee for our soon-to-be-hired project staff. We staged a December 15 launch for our project that involved our librarians, our project partners, and our financial supporters (the Department of Commerce, the Bill & Melinda Gates, and the Rasmuson Foundation of Alaska.)
