The Learning Express application deployment has progressed quickly and the first installment of training for libraries and instructors that have not previously experienced this software application was completed during June 2012. We continued to acquire, receive and distribute signs, as well as, other marketing and outreach materials during this quarter. Each participating library site is recommending the most effective marketing and outreach approach for their communities. The program has already generated some positive publicity in local newspapers, internet, and public service on television announcements for JHH sites. Most of the hardware has been purchased and is being delivered to the appropriate sites. 28 instructors are on board and two candidates are currently under consideration. A full time Instructor for the State Library coordinates training for the other Instructors and focuses them on the needs of each JHH lab according to the needs of their communities. Additional meetings for Instructors have been conducted throughout
