There will not be any construction and we do not anticipate libraries will be affected by construction-related issues.

- 4. You state in your application that "The Alabama Public Library Service (APLS) recommends Apple/Mac computers to provide for the lowest possible costs for their technical configuration and support. Because
 - a. APLS provides essential long-term sustainable support for Alabama library computers, this preference will be respected" Questions:
 - b. Are only Apple computers installed at all the affected Alabama Public Libraries?

Both Apple computers and PCs are currently installed at the affected public libraries. When appropriate, libraries will be encouraged to follow APLS's recommendations and install Apple computers; however, libraries will have a choice of Mac or Windows based computers of various configurations that will best meet their technology needs.

5. What types of computers are installed at the public school? What type of computers are you proposing/recommending?

Alabama's public school systems primarily use PCs. Each school district has established policies that set specifications for technology purchases. Schools will be permitted to purchase new broadband terminals that comply with their existing guidelines.

6. What project programs or applications will require upgraded broadband speeds of 6 Mbps?

Due to the installation of audiovisual conferencing equipment at twenty centers, the highest possible broadband connection speed is needed for high definition video and audio communication. Furthermore, the highest possible connection speed is also needed to support the expansion of broadband workstations at most locations. In most Alabama markets, the major broadband service providers (AT&T and Comcast) offer a maximum connection speed of 6 Mbps without the need for advanced equipment or additional instillation charges.

Outreach

7. What specific outreach methods will the project employ to reach out to the populations that are expected to access broadband at the project schools and libraries? Please align the specific methods to the project marketing and advertising campaign.

The Center for Governmental Services (CGS), an agency of University Outreach at Auburn University, provides services to, and has established relationships with, local governments in all of Alabama's sixty-seven (67) counties. Contacts with specific individuals within the targeted areas will be employed in order to reach the identified populations. CGS will utilize a variety of communication channels and methods based upon the dynamics in each particular area being served.

Auburn University will leverage its Cooperative Extension Program and relationships with state agencies to promote the project directly to underserved populations. Because the majority of public participating libraries are located in remote rural areas without access to standard retail markets, we plan to inform potential users in their neighborhoods where residents gather such as churches, community events, and markets.

The project will identify community leaders who influence others and provide them information about the project that they will then pass on to residents. Some examples of these leaders include preachers, social service providers, directors of community organizations, local government officials, and health care providers. These community leaders will be provided with marketing materials which will assist them to better inform potential users how the expansion of broadband terminals at their local libraries will be of benefit to them. In addition, press conferences will be held at local and state levels to inform the public about the project. A website will also be developed to provide technical support and promote the project.

Wireless network routers...

These lightweight wireless access points, commonly referred to as wireless routers, will be compatible with the IEEE 802.11g standard which can provide up to 108 Mbps and operate at 2.4 GHz unlicensed ISM band. The routers will comply with industry security standards for wireless data encryption, and user authorization, which includes WPA enhanced, interoperable wireless networking security, and support MAC address authentication with 256-user Access Control List (ACL) and VPN pass-through.

RCP base station and extender units...

Intel's Rural Connectivity Platform (RCP) includes a robust long-distance Wi-Fi-based backhaul connection. The RCP nodes are designed to establish point to point links with high data rate/range (throughput 8Mbps@100km). The equipment consists of two radios: one for the access point and one for long-distance links. The operating frequencies are in the standard 802.11 spectrums. c. Please describe function of contractor and/or services provided by Wireless Engineering Research and Education Center.

The faculty and staff of Auburn's Wireless Engineering Research and Education Center (WEREC) will provide professional and standard-setting consultation to the project. Primarily, WEREC will be responsible for modern wireless data communication capability and network deployment including installing wireless networks and RCP Systems.

d. Please detail for training costs, such as hours and hourly rate for training.

Library personnel will be trained to become more effective troubleshooters of broadband computing facilities, allowing them to solve minor problems on their own and avoid having to call in for technical support from APLS or other providers. It's estimated that approximately 90% of participating libraries (100 individuals, total) will take part in 28 hours of training, which is separated into 8 modules. A mix of both classroom and online training options is envisioned. The tuition cost of \$75 per module per person is based on experience with other similar training opportunities previously provided by Auburn University. The \$75 tuition per person covers the costs of food and beverage, audiovisual equipment use fees, training facility fees, reimbursement of instructors' travel expenses, CEU certification, registration, and in the case of the online training (distance education) option, development and delivery of electronic media.

Sustainability

10. We notice no sustainability plan was submitted with your proposal. Please provide a sustainability plan.

Once the new broadband terminals, wireless technology, and audiovisual equipment are purchased and installed, the project is expected to be self-sustaining. The project leverages existing public library facilities and personnel, which are supported over the long-term by local government finances and conventional library revenue sources. Additionally, the project will provide training to public library personnel that will enable them to properly maintain the equipment themselves.

After the end of federal funding for the project, Alabama Public Library Service (APLS) will continue to provide essential long-term support for Alabama library computers, and assist libraries with operating and maintaining the expanded systems within current budgets and staff resources. All technical specifications and recommendations provided through this project will receive the review and approval of the Alabama Public Library Service to ensure the sustainable operation of these systems after federal grant finances are expended.

Many of our small rural libraries do not have the funds to support individualized public relations effort, however, Auburn's library can partner with them to provide research and professional development support that will fill this resource gap and assist them with fund raising efforts. Auburn University Ralph Brown Draughon Library contains over 2.2 million volumes, provides access to over 227 electronic databases, and employs over 200 professional staff. With the expansion and upgrade of computer centers at participating libraries, these rural libraries will be able to utilize new technologies in information access currently delivered by Auburn University's library, which will provide them with more support and services and lead to greater sustainability.

The combined collections from the three University libraries contain over 3 million volumes as well as 2.6 million government documents, 2.5 million microforms, and over 148,000 maps. The Libraries receive over 35,000 current periodicals, of which many are available online.

There is the potential for participating libraries to replace federal funding with new revenue sources by charging local businesses a fee to use the audiovisual equipment and/or to access the internet through the newly installed Wireless Distribution Systems. The development of the training curriculum and instructional media may also be leveraged by Auburn University into a revenue source for the project.

Finally, data collection throughout the three-year term of the project will provide for an impact analysis. This evaluation will demonstrate the achievement of project outcomes, which will enable the project to prioritize further action items and to clearly communicate its successes to stakeholders who may be convinced by the information to support the continuation of the project in the future.
