DEFINITIONS

SIZE OF BUSINESS (See Item 8A)

<u>Small Business concern</u> – A small business concern for the purpose of Government procurement is a concern, including its affiliates, which is independently owned and operated, is not dominant in the field of operation in which it is competing for government contracts and can further qualify under the criteria concerning number of employees, annual average gross revenue, or other criteria, as prescribed by the Small Business Administration. (See Code of Federal Regulations, Title 13, Part 121, as amended, which contains detailed industry definitions and related procedures.)

AVERAGE NUMBER OF EMPLOYEES (See Item 8B)

<u>Number of Employees</u> - In connection with the determination of small business status, number of employees means the average employment of any concern, including the employees of its domestic and foreign affiliates, based on the number of persons employed on a full-time, part-time, temporary, or other basis during each of the pay periods of the preceding 12 months. If a concern has not been in existence for 12 months, number of employees means the average employment of such concerns and its affiliates during the period that such concern has been in existence based on the number of persons employed during each of the pay periods of the period that such concern has been in business.

<u>Affiliates</u> - means associated business concerns or individuals, if directly or indirectly, either one controls or has the power to control the other, or another concern controls or has the power to control both. In determining whether affiliation exists, consideration is given to all appropriate factors including common ownership, common management, and contractual relationships; provided, that restraints imposed by a franchise agreement are not considered in determining whether the franchisor controls or has power to control the franchisee, if the franchisee has the right to profit from its effort, commensurate with ownership, and bears the risk or loss or failure. Any business entity may be found to be an affiliate, whether or not it is organized for profit or located inside the United States.

TYPE OF BUSINESS (See Item 10)

<u>Manufacturer or producer</u> – means a person (or concern) owning, operating, or maintaining a store, warehouse, or other establishment that produces, on the premises, the materials, supplies, articles, or equipment of the general character of those listed in Item 10, or in the Federal Agency's Supplemental Commodity List, if attached.

<u>Service Establishment</u> – means a concern (or person) which owns, operates, or maintains any type of business which is principally engaged in the furnishing of non-personal services, such as (but not limited to) repairing, cleaning, redecorating, or rental of personal property, including the furnishing of necessary repair parts or other supplies as part of the services performed.

TYPE OF OWNERSHIP (See Item 9)

Disadvantaged Small Business – means an offeror that represents as part of its offer, that it is a small business under the size standard applicable to the acquisition and either it has received certification as small disadvantaged business concern consistent with 13 CFR part 124 subpart b; and no materiel change in disadvantaged ownership and control has occurred since its certification; where the concern is owned by one or more disadvantaged individuals the net worth of each individual upon whom the certification is based does not exceed \$750,000 after taking into account their applicable exclusion set forth at 13 CFR 124.104(c)(2) and it is identified on the date of its representation as a certified small Business Administration (Pro-Net).

<u>HUBZone Small Business</u> – means a historically underutilized business zone which is an area located within one or more qualified census tracts, qualified nonmetropolitan counties or lands within the external boundaries of an Indian reservation. A small business concern that appears on the List of Qualified HUB Zone Small Business Concerns maintained by the SBA.

<u>Very Small Business</u> – means a small business concern whose headquarters is located within the geographic area served by a designated SBA district and which together with its affiliates has no more than 15 employees and has average annual receipts that do not exceed \$1 million.

 $\underline{8(A)}$ – Section 8(a) of the Small Business Act established a program that authorizes the Small Business Administration to enter into all types of contracts with other agencies and let subcontract for performing those contracts to firms eligible for program participation. The Small Business Administration for this program must certify you.

<u>Women-Owned Small Business</u> – means a small business concern which is at least 51 percent owned by one or more women or in the case of any publicly owned business at least 51 percent of the stock of which is owned by one or more women; and whose management and daily business operations are controlled by one or more women.

<u>Veteran-Owned Small Business</u> – means not less than 51 percent of which is owned by one or more veteran or, in the case of any publicly owned business, not less than 51 percent of the stock of which is owned by one or more veterans; and the management and daily business operations of which are controlled by one or more veterans.

<u>Service Connected Disabled Veteran-Owned Small Business</u> – A business that is at least 51 percent owned by a person(s) and managed by a service-connected disabled veteran(s) or any publicly owned small business, not less than 51 percent of the stock of which is owned by one or more service-connected disabled veteran. The term "service-connected" means, with respect to disability that such disability was incurred or aggravated in the line of duty in the active military, naval, or air service.
