CHART NAME: APPLICATIONS FOR IMMIGRATION BENEFITS


WHAT IT DISPLAYS: The below chart provides data on applications and petitions received by USCIS for immigration benefits in November 2012. This chart excludes all data associated with the citizenship related applications.

WHAT IT SHOWS: Immigration application receipts increased by 31 percent compared to the number received in November 2011. November 2012 approvals increased by 25 percent, denials decreased by 22 percent, and pending increased by 24% compared to November 2011.
