CHART NAME: APPLICATIONS FOR IMMIGRATION BENEFITS


WHAT IT DISPLAYS: The below chart provides data on applications and petitions received by USCIS for immigration benefits in October 2012. This chart excludes all data associated with the citizenship related applications.

WHAT IT SHOWS: Immigration application receipts increased by 59 percent compared to the number received in October 2011. October 2012 approvals increased by 23 percent, denials increased by 13 percent, and pending increased by 22% compared to October 2011.

- Major volumes of pending applications at the end of October 2012 include: 683,620 I-130 immediate/all other petitions; 342,290 I-485 applications to adjust status; 132,444 I-765 employment authorizations; 125,056 I-751 remove conditions spouse jointly/waive; 111,068 I-90 green card renewals/replacements; 79,477 I-129 forms filed; 42,290 I-131 travel document/advance parole.
